Though it has been reported on, here and there and now and then, I wasn't aware until a few weeks ago.

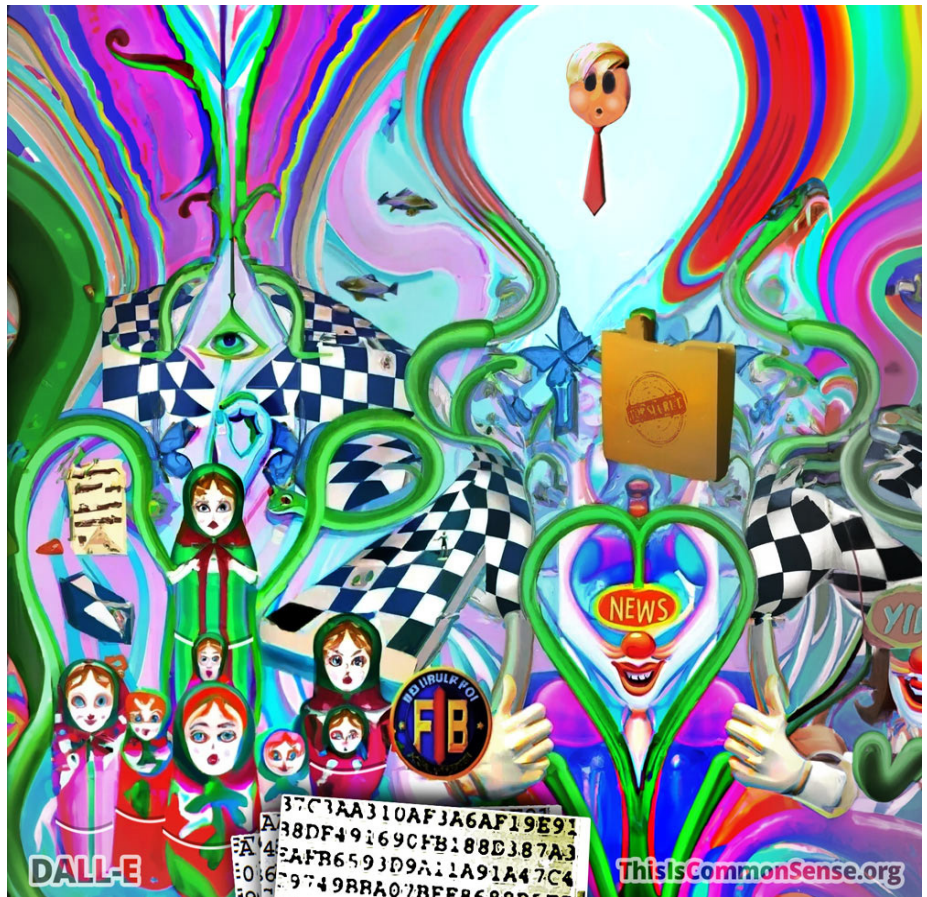
Most major network news outfits do not make much of it.
