RFK, Jr., is clearly more afraid of Democrats wielding power than he is of former President Donald Trump. That's why the independent dropped out of the presidential race last week and endorsed Mr. Trump, the Republican Party nominee.

"I began this journey as a Democrat," <u>explained</u> Robert Kennedy, Jr., stating that it was "the party of my father [the likely Democratic presidential nominee in 1968, when he was assassinated], my uncle [President John F. Kennedy, assassinated in 1963], the party which I pledged my own allegiance to long before I was old enough to vote. I attended my first Democratic Convention at the age of six...."

But last October, RFK, Jr., left the Democratic Party, arguing that

Democrats have "departed so dramatically from the core values that" he "grew up with," that it has "become the party of war, censorship, corruption, big Pharma, big Tech, big Ag, and big money."

And he also acted out of necessity, when the party "abandoned democracy by canceling the primary to conceal the cognitive decline of the sitting president."*

Kennedy bitterly complained about the efforts of Democrats to deny him a spot on <u>state ballots</u>, blasting "DNC-aligned judges" that threw him "and other candidates off the ballot—and" have attempted "to throw President Trump in jail."

NBC News <u>suggested</u> that Kennedy sees Trump as "a partner—and a fellow victim." Probably so, but RFKj specifically cited "Free speech, the war in Ukraine, and the war on our children" as "the principled causes that persuaded [him] to leave the Democratic Party and run as an independent, and now to throw my support to President Trump."
